These new murals will feature imagery and messaging that are intended to promote social-emotional well being and nutrition for our students, staff, and community members. We're working with local artists Skye Amber Sweet and Katie C Shipley to design beautiful artwork that will brighten our campus and our neighborhood.

<u>Who are we?</u> Kester Avenue Elementary and Kester Magnet is a diverse learning community of over 1,000 students, kindergarten through fifth grade. We are at Title I school, meaning that over half of our students qualify for free and reduced lunches. Kester's most recent Academic Performance Index (API) score was 913 out of a possible 1,000 - the highest API of all Sherman Oaks schools. In 2019 the State Department of Education named Kester a Distinguished California School. Kester Elementary School's PTA is a tightly knit group of parents, educators, and administrators dedicated to serving our children, students, and the entire school community. We are highly motivated and confident in our abilities to see this project through to completion. We have a team of stakeholders working diligently on this project including PTA members, administrators, and local artists; all individuals who have experience in planning and completing complex projects such as this.

<u>Who are the artists?</u> Artists were selected based on several factors including affordable pricing, quality of work, professionalism, and previous experience completing works of art in public spaces in our neighborhood and beyond.

Artist candidates were invited to attended a campus walkthrough with PTA members and administrators to tour campus and discuss mural ideas. From there, artists submitted quotes detailing the cost, scope, and timeline of proposed work. Stakeholders then compared quotes in order to determine which artists would best meet our needs.

Projected timeline

Work on this project is set to start as soon as possible, ideally before our school reopens for hybrid learning, which is tentatively scheduled for April 2021.

Katie C Shipley can start as early as March 22nd. She estimates that it will take her 7-8 days to complete, making the potential completion date April 1, depending on weather and other factors that could affect timing.

Skye Amber Sweet can start as early as possible and estimates that she will need approximately three days to complete the mural.

LETTER OF DETERMINATION

January 15, 2020

Dear Amanda:

In response to request of this office concerning your PTA's tax-exempt status, a copy of our group ruling letter dated November 18, 1943, from Internal Revenue, which grants federal income tax exemption to all PTAs in California, is enclosed. You will note the Internal Revenue Code section at that time as referred to in the letter was 101(6)—now Section 501(c)(3) as indicated in all PTA bylaws in California. The group exemption number assigned to the California State PTA is GEN-0646.

Also enclosed is a copy of the February 24, 2010 letter from Franchise Tax Board confirming PTA's exemption from state franchise or income tax under Section 23701d of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

Both the federal and state exemption letters cover all of our divisions—local units (associations), councils and districts. The letters are issued to the California Congress of Parents and Teachers, Inc. The corporate name was changed as indicated on this letterhead by vote of the annual convention on May 5, 1978, and has been recorded and filed with the Secretary of State with certificate endorsed on August 14, 1978.

Kester Avenue Elementary PTA is a unit in good standing. It was organized on May 24, 1951 according to our official records, and is chartered as a member organization of the California Congress of Parents, Teachers, and Students, Inc.
