Motion by Sue Steinberg: Move to approve the project and the over height fencing and proposed landscaping plan and sound wall, and request the addition of neighborhood protection measures to include: limit to 10 week end day events (Sat-Sun) to cease by 9 p.m. no more than 15 night events (Mon-Fri) to cease by 9 p.m. provide a shared calendar with adjacent property owners, no more than 35 children during the school day shall be on the playground at one time, no audible

bells or outdoor noise amplification. Further, recommend an arborist review the health of the cypress and report back to the S.O. PLUM committee.

Motion seconded by Lisa Petrus, passed unanimously.

7B.) Al Fresco Ordinance- The City wants to make the Al Fresco Emergency Ordinance they approved during the pandemic, permanent.

Motion by Jeff Kalban: Support the ordinance if amended. Al Fresco Ordinance must address the inequity between restaurants paying fees because of their lack of parking and those using parking spots for dining and not paying fees. Public and private property uses should be combined in the ordinance. Seconded by Lisa Petrus. Passed unanimously.
