VNY History

- 1928 Metropolitan Airport established by a small group of citizens
- 1942 U.S. government purchases and converts to a military base
- 1949 U.S. War Assets Administration quitclaimed the airport to the City of Los Angeles.
- 1957 Final name change to Van Nuys Airport
- Currently VNY serves the community, travelers and tourists. Services based at VNYs include fire, police, air ambulance, search and rescue





VAN NUYS AIRPORT

VNY Today

- \$2B in annual economic activity*
- 10,000 jobs are directly supported by airport activity*
- 200 businesses are located at VNY
- 730 acres in total area
- 19 flight schools operate at VNY



VNY Vision Study

An Airport Land Use Compatibility Study

vi•sion n. 1 the ability to think about or plan the future with imagination or wisdom

The Vision Study is an initial step to collect information and feedback from the community to evaluate the airport's land use designations for improved compatibility with the surrounding community. The Vision Study will develop a report that will incorporate new technology that further embraces sustainability, enhances airport facilities, strengthens VNY as a regional jobs base, and increases access and diversity in aviation.



VNY Vision Study

Airport Plan & Vision Study The VNY Airport Plan was adopted in 2006 as a 20-year plan by the Los Angeles City Council to guide land use development at the airport. As 2026 approaches, LAWA, as the owner, is engaging with surrounding communities, stakeholders, and technical experts to create a comprehensive vision for the next 20 years that supports the community and the continued operation of VNY as a general aviation airport through a Vision Study

Community Outreach

- Hosted three open Houses for neighbors and stakeholders

- Engaged with industry stakeholders, local elected officials and government departments

- Coordinated with LAWA's Technical Advisory Team







Study Considerations

1. Considering land use designations.

- New observation park on west side of airport
- Incorporate "public works" site into west side of airport
- Convert aviation designation located off airfield to commercial
- Convert commercial with airfield access to aviation
- Convert commercial on Hart to aviation (eliminated after community feedback)
- Relocate aviation maintenance school to south end (eliminated after community feedback)


2. Prioritizing the revival of available parcels.

- Identify appropriate parcels to incorporate eVTOL
- Identify appropriate new locations for updated infrastructure

3. Consolidating land use categories.






