Motion: Discussion and Possible Action to file a (Community Impact Statement (CIS) to CF 23-4111). This resolution is the official statement adopted by the Sherman Oaks Neighborhood Council (SONC) Board at a Brown Act compliant meeting. The Sherman Oaks Neighborhood Council (SONC) satisfies the ½ of all 22 board seats, a minimum of 15 voting board members, requirement of SB 411 and approves meeting virtually and/or use of teleconferencing for board and/or committee meetings, in accordance with the rules established by Senate Bill 411 and the subsequent motion passed by the City Council on November 1, 2023. The special virtual and teleconferencing rules available to Los Angeles Neighborhood Councils are necessary because this action will allow for increased accessibility, increased community engagement, and health and safety of the participants.

3. Adjournment

Motions are introduced either by the Committee from which they were adopted, in which case the motion requires no second (denoted by "from committee"); or by an individual board member ("from floor"), in which case the motion requires a second. Items initiated via Consent Calendar are considered and voted on as one motion; members may request to take an item out of Calendar to consider said item individually.
